The stage-coach crews, drivers, horses, mules, and coach will all be there. Other "living history" people there will include Steve Gesell with his Cowboy Camp, and the U. S. Cavalry re-enactors who were with us last year. It will be a wonderful start for this very special three-day event involving many local nonprofit groups from three counties. There will be regular stops to change horses and passengers and take on mail at Tenino City Park (6 pm Friday and overnight); Grand Mound (10:15 am Saturday); Chehalis Woodland Estates Retirement Center (2:45 pm Saturday); Lewis and Clark State Park (7:00 pm Saturday and overnight); Vader (11:00 am Sunday); Castle Rock Fairgrounds (3:00 pm Sunday); and finally Longview (Cowlitz County Fairgrounds—7:00 pm Sunday).

Also brief stops along the way at Wolf Haven (Tenino), Borst Park (Centralia), Great Wolf Lodge (Grand Mound), an old town jail in Toledo, where we may need to take on special passengers, and other places of interest.

All regular stage stops will feature food, music, living history performers and demonstrations, the THA traveling mercantile, opportunities to purchase raffle tickets and send commemorative envelopes by stage. Each stage stop will have its own special postmark. Tumwater Middle School Homesteaders will be at many of the stops in period attire, helping with the event, playing old fashioned games, and more.


